Headline News – By Land and By Sea

Lampson International was a major participant in the transport of the largest load ever moved by road in British Columbia. The cargo was a 23' diameter turbine runner weighing 415,000 lbs and capable of producing over 500 megawatts of power for the Revelstoke 5 project. The runner was manufactured in Brazil by Voith Hydro Power and shipped to Portland, Oregon where it was transloaded to a Foss Maritime barge for river transport to Pasco, WA. At the Port of Pasco, Lampson unloaded the Runner using a 4100 Ringer and assisted in loading it onto a Beam Type Trailer supplied and operated by Intermountain Rigging. Once the Runner was moved by road to a loading area above Grand Coulee Dam, Lampson transferred it to a 6-line Goldhofer trailer for barge loading and subsequent shipping across Lake Roosevelt. From there it was barged up the Columbia River to the Shelter Bay Ferry Launch, which is located about 45 Kilometers from its final destination. Lampson coordinated the ro-ro procedure of the cargo at Shelter Bay and assisted Sheedy Drayage in the assembly of their Beam Trailer. Once the trailer was assembled, Lampson transferred the runner to the trailer for the Canadian portion of the heavy haul. Once transported to the top of Revelstoke Dam, the cargo was again transferred to the Goldhofer Trailer for a one mile trip down a 12% grade. In addition to the 12% grade, the trailer had to maneuver through a tunnel with less than two inches of clearance in some areas, before coming to its final resting place in the powerhouse. News from Around the World - Lampson Australia Stays Busy

All is well “down under” despite the world wide industry “down turn” and the Australian branch of Lampson has been fortunate to experience a continuity of projects this year in all areas (cranage, over-dimensional haulage, and jacking) with the following projects being of interest.

Cranage - Fourteen units on the one project ranging from the M18000 in Maxer configuration, M16000, M2250 Maxer etc. down to the smaller Grove units assisting to develop a new coal loading facility at Kooragang Island which is located about an hour from our Toronto NSW facility. The abundance of “Blue” from the air is pretty impressive when flying into Newcastle airport.

Haulage - A particular project of interest is the Onshore Gas Plant construction at Wadeye near Darwin. Varied transport configurations from a simple 6 line truck powered Goldhofer to a twin Propelled 34 line heavy specification Goldhofer for the movement of a 70M long module (photograph below). The project is located in very picturesque country with fantastic beaches but the abundance of crocodiles make swimming an unwise choice.

Jacking - A variety of jacking projects (Mining Shovels, Turbines etc.) have been undertaken Australia wide and requests for Lampson services of this type continue to increase in popularity.
